\*UPDATE: May 17, 2019

Below are the posted DFO way-points defining the outermost limits of the "one mile surf-line" until July 15, 2019. All areas inside of this line (with the exception of already-closed Chinook protection areas) are open for sportfishing.

Retention is 2 Chinook per day, 4 in possession, with a minimum length of 45cm. Coho are currently closed until June 1st.

Bottom fishing is open outside the 1 nautical mile surf-line for retention. Check local regulations for limit sizes and daily/possession limits.

## **WCVI** offshore

Effective 00:01h Apr. 19 to 23:59h Jul. 14, 2019 in Subareas 20-1 and 20-2, and Area 121 and Areas 125 to 126 seaward of a 1 nm boundary line there is no retention of Chinook. This boundary line is defined as follows:

then to 49º 22.113' N 126º 33.508' W seaward of Estevan Point,

then to 49º 23.869' N 126º 35.333' W seaward of Homais Cove,

then to 49º 27.766' N 126º 35.971' W seaward of Split Cape,

then to 49º 31.494' N 126º 35.669' W seaward of Escalante Point,

then to 49º 34.042' N 126º 41.611' W seaward of Maguinna Point,

then to 49º 36.254' N 126º 50.538' W seaward of Bajo Point,

then to 49º 39.892' N 126º 55.125' W seaward of Skuna Bay,

then to 49º 44.400' N 127º 00.289' W seaward of Ferrer Point,

then to 49º 50.767' N 127º 10.151' W seaward of Tatchu Point,

then to 49º 59.142' N 127º 28.125' W seaward of Lookout Island,

then to 50° 06.948' N 127° 41.617' W seaward of Jackobson Point,

Effective 00:01h July 15 to 23:59h Dec. 31, in Areas 121 and 123 to 127 and Subareas 20-1 to 20-2 the daily limit is 2 Chinook per day.
